Areas of learning:

Throughout this term:

As <u>Scientists</u> we will be investigating plant reproduction, the life cycles of plants, animals and humans and looking closely at how the world is changing around us. We will be developing our investigative skills by carrying out a range of studies that require so to set up a fair test, make observations, record results and create scientific conclusions.

As <u>Design Technologists</u> we will be developing our skills as cooks, looking at designing, creating and evaluating a Fairtrade product to sell to the rest of the school in order to raise money for the rainforest alliance.

As <u>Artists</u> we shall be looking closely at animals and their unique patterns and colours. We will be looking closely at the work of the artist 'Hemmsley' who created colourful and vibrant images representing the rainforest. We will be using pastels, paints and other media to create equally vibrant art pieces.

As <u>Historians</u> we will be looking at how rainforests have changed over the years and how tribes and modern influences have effected the Brazilian Rainforest.

As <u>Geographers</u> will be looking at and comparing biomes with the rainforest. We shall be locating the worlds rainforests on a world map and looking at why they are located in those particular regions. We shall be studying average rainfall in the rainforest and comparing it to rainfall in Britain.



English:

As writers we shall be continuing our exploration of a range of genres. We shall be looking in depth at The Kapok Tree by Lynne Cherry. We will be investigating a rage of genres including: diaries, letters, newspapers and persuasive writing techniques.

Maths:

As mathematicians we shall be focusing on an array of mathematical areas in both arithmetic and reasoning. We shall be continuing to study: written methods for addition, subtraction, multiplication & division, investigating factors, multiples and prime numbers and learning how to draw and measure angles accurately.
